## AGREEMENT ON ACTIVITY EXCHANGE

between

## **Geological Society Located in Taipei**

and

## The Geochemical Society of Japan

Geological Society Located in Taipei (GST) and Geochemical Society of Japan (GSJ) (hereafter referred to the two societies), in the conviction that the activity between the two societies will promote scientific research and communication for the benefit of geochemistry, hereby conclude the following agreements.

- **Article 1.** The two societies agree to have mutual discussion on cooperative and collaborative activities for promoting scientific research. This agreement defines the principles and methods of cooperation that the GST and GSJ wish to develop between them under equal partnership.
- **Article 2.** In order to support the activity stated in Article 1, the two societies agree to promote and support their member's contribution to and attendance at annual meetings of two societies and Goldschmidt<sup>®</sup> Conference, a broad-scope conference covering all aspects of geochemistry, cosmochemistry, and geology.
- **Article 3.** The two societies agree to carry out the above activities in accordance with the laws and regulations of the respective countries after full consultation and approval of the two societies. It is understood that implementation of any type of cooperation stated in Article 2 may be restricted depending upon the availability of resources and financial support. The execution of this agreement will not cause any financial obligations to either society.
- **Article 4.** This Agreement is valid for five years effective from the date of the final signature affixed below by the two societies. The term of the Agreement is extended unless either society expresses the intention of terminating the Agreement. Either society may terminate the Agreement during the five-year term by giving a written notice to the other society six months in advance.

**Article 5.** This Agreement is executed only in English.
